Sachchidananda

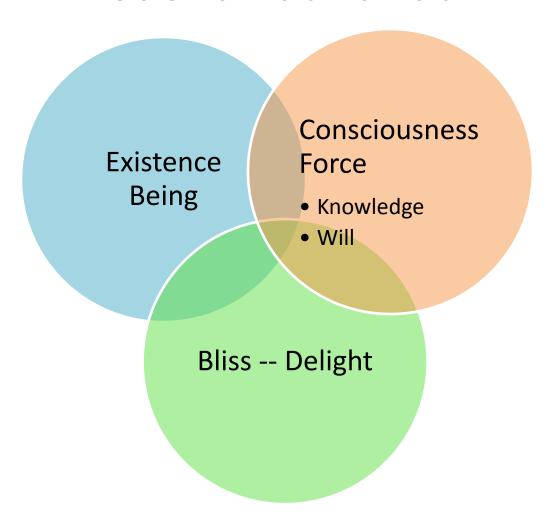
- Pure unitarian consciousness

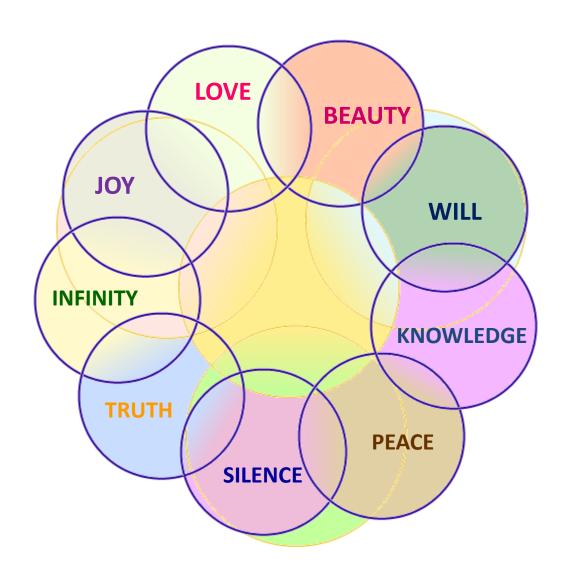

Three Poises of Supermind

Comprehending	Austen as <u>author</u> conceives the story
Apprehending	Austen as <u>director</u> executes in space & time
Spiritual Individual	Austen as <u>actor</u> performs each distinct role

Comprehensive Supermind

- Equal self-extension of Sachchidananda
- All-comprehending, all-possessing, allcontaining
- No individualization
- All is developed in unity and as one
- All are forms of Divine Consciousness, not separate existences



Apprehending Supermind

- An unequal instead of equable concentration
- Knowledge centralizes itself and stand back from its works to observe them.
- The Conscious Soul accompanies his Force of consciousness into its works
- Soul inhabits each form and observes itself in other forms from that practical center of consciousness





Spiritual Individual

- Blissful dualism in unity
- Dualism, variation is dominant and unity is background
- God takes on a million personalities and develops and experiences them but never forgets he is God.
- Spiritual Individual is universal and impersonal, free of all human conditioning and therefore capable of uniqueness



Vidya

- The true spiritual individual does not arrogate to itself an independent, separate existence.
- It is still conscious of the One, its true Self
- The Conscious Soul knows the whole of which it and all other souls are a part
- It is conscious of its power of self-creation in Space & Time
- It knows the joy of differentiation as well as the joy of unity

Avidya

- Ignorance begins when the subject loses consciousness that it is the one Conscious Soul
- This is the point where Mind has its origin and makes the great lapse from Truth Consciousness into division and ignorance
- In Ignorance the subject loses consciousness that other forms are forms of itself and forms of the one Conscious Soul
- We rely on sensation and thought to know the world indirectly
- We live in a false sense of separateness
